First Reading 1 Kgs 19:16. 19-21

A reading from the first book of the Kings Elisha rose and followed Elijah and became his servant.

The Lord said to Elijah: 'Go, you are to anoint Elisha son of Shaphat, of Abel Meholah, as prophet to succeed you.' Leaving there, Elijah came on Elisha son of Shaphat as he was ploughing behind twelve yoke of oxen, he himself being with the twelfth. Elijah passed near to him and threw his cloak over him. Elisha left his oxen and ran after Elijah. 'Let me kiss my father and mother, then I will follow you' he said. Elijah answered, 'Go, go back; for have I done anything to you?' Elisha turned away, took the pair of oxen and slaughtered them. He used the plough for cooking the oxen, then gave to his men, who ate. He then rose, and followed Elijah and became his servant.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 15:1-2. 5. 7-11. R. cf. v.5 (R.) You are my inheritance, O Lord.

- Preserve me, God, I take refuge in you.
 I say to the Lord: 'You are my God.'
 O Lord, it is you who are my portion and cup; it is you yourself who are my prize. (R.)
- I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel, who even at night directs my heart.
 I keep the Lord ever in my sight: since he is at my right hand, I shall stand firm. (R.)
- And so my heart rejoices, my soul is glad; even my body shall rest in safety.

Second Reading Gal 5:1. 13-18

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians *My brothers, you were called to freedom.*

When Christ freed us, he meant us to remain free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to the yoke of slavery.

My brothers, you were called, as you know, to liberty; but be careful, or this liberty will provide an opening for self-indulgence. Serve one another, rather, in works of love, since the whole of the Law is summarised in a single command: Love your neighbour as yourself. If you go snapping at each other and tearing each other to pieces, you had better watch or you will destroy the whole community.

Let me put it like this: if you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you.

Gospel Acclamation 1 Sm 3:9; Jn 6:68

Alleluia, alleluia!

Speak, O Lord, your servant is listening; you have the words of everlasting life. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk 9:51-62

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke Jesus resolutely set his face towards Jerusalem. I will follow you wherever you will go.

As the time drew near for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely took the road for Jerusalem and sent

messengers ahead of him. These set out, and they went into a Samaritan village to make preparations for him, but the people would not receive him because he was making for Jerusalem. Seeing this, the disciples James and John said, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to burn them up?' But he turned and rebuked them, and they went off to another village.



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As they travelled along they met a man on the road who said to him, 'I will follow you wherever y ou go.' Jesus answered, 'Foxes have holes and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head.' Another to whom he said, 'Follow me,' replied, 'Let me go and bury my father first.' But he answered, 'Leave the dead to bury their dead; your duty is to go and spread the news of the kingdom of God.'

Another said, 'I will follow you, sir, but first let me go and say good-bye to my people at home.' Jesus said to him, 'Once the hand is laid on the plough, no one who looks back is fit for the kingdom of God.'

REFLECTION by Fr Victor

As the X World Meeting of Families is taking place in Rome from June 22 to 26, 2022, each diocese will place families at the at the centre of pastoral attention, carrying out activities that reflect the theme of the WMOF. The theme is: "Family love: a vocation and a path to holiness." It will be a kind of "Family Week" in unity with families and dioceses around the world. The Pastoral Kit to prepare for the X WMOF in particular churches says, "Each family is called to open up and give itself, but also to welcome the help of other families. In today's individualistic societies, where families suffer from loneliness and isolation, especially in situations of serious difficulty, the community becomes crucial in saving families, making them feel that they are not alone in every challenge they are called to face (raising children, illness, grief, economic difficulties...)" This weekend we celebrate Family Mass to pray for all the families.

In his letter to the Hebrews, St. Paul reminds them and us today to remember always to welcome strangers, for by doing this, some have entertained angels without knowing it. (Heb 13:2)

This was exactly what the woman in the first reading did for the Elisha the Prophet. She welcomed him and made him feel at home in her own house. Hospitality was her act of love and ministry.


In the gospel for this Sunday Jesus clearly says that he is above everyone and everything in our lives — even family! But this does not mean that we ignore or dismiss others, especially those who might be in any sort of need. If we say that we are indeed Christian and follow the message and example of Jesus, then we are to be actively concerned about others around us. Jesus also says that whoever welcomes and serves his followers, welcomes, and serves him. (Mt 10:40)

There would be something seriously wrong if we said that we were followers of Jesus and the gospel, but the quality of our daily lives did not show this. There would be something not quite right if we said we believed in loving our brothers and sisters, but our actions showed the opposite. As the Letter of St. James (2:17) reminds us; 'faith, if good deeds do not go with it, is quite dead'. When we gather to pray with each other at the Eucharist, we do so as brothers and sisters of Jesus and each other. Just before mass ends, we are sent out with these words of mission, 'Go now to love and serve the Lord'. Having heard the word of God and shared the Body and Blood of Christ, we are sent out to love and serve the Lord by loving

and serving each other. Having prayed and precisely because we have prayed, we are to turn our attention to our brother and sisters, especially those who are in most need

Through the gospel, we hear Jesus asking us to commit our daily lives to him as his followers. May we also reach out and offer hospitality and kindness to those around us, especially those most in need of our help.

PRAYING THE GOSPELS


