THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT – YEAR A

Third Candle

Priest: The third week of Advent we remember the gift of Joy we have in Christ. We remember the joy that Mary felt when the angel Gabriel told her that a special child would be born to her - a child who would save and deliver all people. Joy is the gift we all receive from the unconditional love Christ has for us.

Priest: God wants us all to have joy. The angel who announced to the shepherds that Jesus had been born told them: "Do not be afraid. I am bringing you good news of great joy for all people -for to you is born this day, in the City of David, a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord." As we light this candle, we remember that

Christ came to bring true and everlasting joy to all people. As we light this candle, we are reminded that Christ came to save all people.

(Someone lights the first two purple candles and the pink candle on the Advent Wreath.)

All: Let us pray - Loving God, we thank you for the joy you bring us. Help us prepare our hearts for the Lord's coming by helping us see that Christ came for every person we meet wherever we go. We ask this in the name of the one born in Bethlehem, Jesus our Lord.

All: Amen.

First ReadingIs 35:1-6, 10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

God himself will come and save us. Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy. The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God. Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look, your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.' Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return. They will come to Zion shouting for joy,

everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation Is 61:1 (Lk 4:18)

Alleluia, alleluia! The Spirit of the Lord is upon me; he sent me to bring Good News to the poor. Alleluia!

Gospel Mt 11:2-11

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew Are you the one who is to come, or must we wait for someone else?

John in his prison had heard what Christ was doing and he sent his disciples to ask him, 'Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?' Jesus answered, 'Go back and tell John what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me.' As the messengers were leaving, Jesus began to talk to the people about John: 'What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed swaying in the breeze? No? Then what did you go out to see? A man wearing fine clothes? Oh no, those who wear fine clothes are to be found in palaces. Then what did you go out for? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and much more than a prophet: he is the one of whom scripture says: Look, I am going to send my messenger before you; he will prepare your way before you. I tell you solemnly, of all the children born of women, a greater than John the Baptist has never been seen; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'

REFLECTION by Fr Victor

One of the most well-known Christmas carols is 'Joy to world.' The words to this carol were written by Isaac Watts in 1719. At Christmas it will be sung all over the world. The third Sunday of Advent is called 'Gaudete' Sunday which means 'Joy' or 'Rejoice'. The opening antiphon for this Sunday's liturgy asks us to Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near. We rejoice because of the signs associated with the coming of the Messiah. The gospel of this Sunday tells of the signs that are associated with the coming of the saviour of humanity. The disciples of John the Baptist were told to report back to their master that the blind see again, and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor. The words of Jesus Christ to the disciples of John the Baptist re-echo the prophecy of Isaiah featured in the first reading of this Sunday. We are filled with joyful anticipation of the feast of Nativity. Our joy lies in the experience of wholeness that Christmas brings. The deprived of our community will express similar joy if our generosity is extended to them this Christmas. The birth of the saviour in our hearts will motivate actions that will bring joy to the hearts of our neighbours. The

miraculous joy of Christmas is founded on God's generosity. God gave his only son Jesus Christ to be born for the salvation of humanity. Similarly, our generosity, motivated by the birth of the messiah in our heart, will bring joy to the hearts of the lonely and abandoned, the poor and homeless, the sad, confused, and undecided etc. Generosity brings joy to the hearts of the poor.
