And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any

credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

REFLECTION by Fr Victor

In these Sundays of Ordinary Time, coming after Christmas Time, we can hear so clearly the radical call of following Jesus Christ. The gospel readings teach us the 'New Order', the 'New Way', the 'Way of Christ', the 'Christian Way'.

In our gospel this Sunday, Jesus puts before us the question and the dilemma of what we should and how we are to behave when someone says or does something to us that is so painful. Do we return one painful word or action with the same anger? Jesus knows and quotes the Jewish Law. It was allowed to take 'an eye for an eye and tooth for tooth.'

However, as with last week's gospel, Jesus wants his disciples and us to go further. As his followers and disciples today and following his own example, Jesus asks us not to respond with anger, aggression, or violence when a wrong is done to or against us. We are called not to let another person's behaviour towards us to lash out in violence, verbally or in action. Challenging and difficult as this is, we are to take as our model, the life, and actions of Jesus himself. This is the cost of being a Christian. This may sound naive, simplistic, unrealistic, and even foolish. And while it can be done, it is by no means easy. There are three examples that we can look to and learn from. Mahatma Gandhi responded to unjust laws and oppression with passive non-resistance. He stood up and spoke out against the wrongs he saw, but he did not respond with violence. Maximilian Kolbe, who gave his life in the concentration camp for that of another man, refused to hate those who killed him. And finally, Martin Luther King, following Gandhi's example also protested against racism peacefully. By following the example of Jesus, who did not return violence with violence, these three great figures also had their life brutally taken from them. Yet their message and example live on today for us. We may not be asked to give our lives for the gospel, but we are asked to offer each other the hand of peace, reconciliation, and forgiveness. Somebody has to have the courage to take the first step to stop the violence. Stay Healthy, Stay Safe and Stay Blessed!

Historical Context

Let him have your cloak as well

This one is a little stranger to our modern cultural norms. In Jesus' time, it was not shameful or embarrassing for a person to be naked but it was shameful for the person who caused them to be naked. By law, if you were unable to repay a debt, the person to whom you owed money could literally take your clothes as payment of the debt. What Jesus says is, if someone demands your tunic as payment of a debt, give them everything you're wearing to shame them for making you naked to collect their debt.

Roman soldiers were allowed by their own military laws to require any person to carry the soldier's pack along the road from one milestone marker to another. That is, they could order a man to walk one mile with their pack. If they made someone carry their pack for more than one mile, the soldier himself was subject to discipline and punishment. Jesus says, 'If anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him.' Like turning the other cheek, it is turning the tables on the one who would oppress you and bringing shame upon them.
