REFLECTION by Fr Victor

On this 14th Sunday of the Church's Ordinary time, she calls us in a special way to reflect on Jesus' humility, gentleness. These twin virtues of humility and gentleness are very necessary for our Christian journey.

Humility and gentleness are two virtues we should learn from Jesus. Jesus says, "learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart." We learn Jesus' humility from the manger in Bethlehem to small town Nazareth, and finally on the Cross. In fact, when we humbly serve our brothers and sisters in need, we will understand how humble God is. When we are patient and gentle to little ones, we will experience how God is kind and merciful to us all. Jesus used his humility to conquer Satan's pride. So, we, Jesus' disciples, should practice the virtue of humility to overcome our prideful heart. Arrogance and selfishness are always there. We have to guard them; don't let them have a chance to dominate our heart.

The wonderful thing is when we take time to be with Jesus to learn from him, he will give us rest. Many people think that going to Mass or spending time with Jesus in the church or chapel is a burden or waste of time. No, it is just opposite. I heard some people say something like: I pray to God to make me love him more, but look like I don't have it, so be it. Do you see what's wrong with that thought? I reply: If you want to love God, but you don't want to have time with him every day, or you don't want to read and reflect on the scriptures, or you don't want to go to Mass regularly, how can God help you? No virtue or adoration will come as natural, but we should practice till they become natural.

Dear friends, Jesus' teaching is always practical. He invites us to take his yokes and learn from him. He will make our *yoke become easy and our burden light.* May the Holy Spirit enkindle our zeal of learning from our gentle and humble King.
