First Reading Ezekiel 18:25-28

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

The word of the Lord was addressed to me as follows: 'You object, "What the Lord does is unjust." Listen, you House of Israel: is what I do unjust? Is it not what you do that is unjust? When the upright man renounces his integrity to commit sin and dies because of this, he dies because of the evil that he himself has committed. When the sinner renounces sin to become law-abiding and honest, he deserves to live. He has chosen to renounce all his previous sins; he shall certainly live; he shall not die.'

(R.) Remember your mercies, O Lord.

- Lord, make me know your ways. Lord, teach me your paths. Make me walk in your truth, and teach me: for you are God my saviour. (R.)

Second Reading

Philippians 2:1-11

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

If our life in Christ means anything to you, if love can persuade at all, or the Spirit that we have in common, or any tenderness and sympathy, then be united in your convictions and united in your love, with a common purpose and a common mind. That is the one thing which would make me completely happy. There must be no competition among you, no conceit; but everybody is to be self-effacing. Always consider the other person to be better than yourself, so that nobody thinks of his own interests first but everybody thinks of other people's interests instead. In your minds you must be the same as Christ Jesus:

His state was divine, vet he did not cling to his equality with God but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as men are; and being as all men are, he was humbler yet, even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel

Matthew 21:28-32

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'What is your opinion? A man ha d two sons. He went and said to the first, "My boy, you go and work in the vineyard today." He answered, "I will not go," but afterwards

thought better of it and went. The man then went and said the same thing to the second who answered, "Certainly, sir," but did not go. Which of the two did the father's will?' 'The first' they said. Jesus said to them, 'I tell you



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solemnly, tax collectors and prostitutes are making their way into the kingdom of God before you. For John came to you, a pattern of true righteousness, but you did not believe him, and yet the tax collectors and prostitutes did. Even after seeing that, you refused to think better of it and believe in him.'

REFLECTION by Tony Warwarek

Matthew 21:28-32 (NIV):

No, I won't! Yes, I will!

In this parable, Jesus uses the story of two sons to illustrate the concept of repentance and obedience. The first son initially refused to work in the vineyard but later changed his mind and obeyed his father's command. The second son, on the other hand, initially agreed to go but did not follow through with his promise.

The parable is a lesson to the religious leaders of the time, but also to us, highlighting that outward appearances and professions of faith are not enough. It emphasizes the importance of genuine repentance and obedience to God's will, even for those who may have initially rejected it. Jesus implies that tax collectors and prostitutes, often seen as sinners, were more receptive to God's message and were entering the kingdom of God because they repented and believed, while the religious leaders were not.

We can readily be judgmental about others at times when we are not aware. We can sometimes catch ourselves out as our sub-conscious mind breaks through. This can even surprise us when we realise that beneath the external appearance, we are not always as we seem or as we want to be. In short, we are hypocrites just like many of the Pharisees. We need to reflect on our actions and thoughts constantly.

Some examination of conscience at the end of each day can keep us close to our real selves. This reflection allows us to have a change of heart when our initial response may have been selfish, spiteful, or revengeful. There is usually time to review selfish decisions, but we also need to ask for the Lord's strength to 'put our pride in our pocket' : review our decision, change it, and apologise, when it is appropriate. Let us be prepared to be forthright in our choices and decisions for the good of others and ourselves.

This parable challenges us to examine our own hearts and actions and to prioritize sincere repentance and obedience to God's commands.
