Malachi 1:14 - 2:2. 8-10

A reading from the prophet Malachi

I am a great king, says the Lord of hosts, and my name is feared throughout the nations. And now, priests, this warning is for you. If you do not listen, if you do not find it in your heart to glorify my name, says the Lord of hosts, I will send the curse on you and curse your very blessing. You have strayed from the way; you have caused many to stumble by your teaching. You have destroyed the covenant of Levi, says the Lord of hosts. And so I in my turn have made you contemptible and vile in the eyes of the whole people in repayment for the way you have not kept to my paths but have shown partiality in your administration.

Have we not all one Father? Did not one God create us? Why, then, do we break faith with one another, profaning the covenant of our ancestors?

1 Thessalonians 2:7-9. 13

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Thessalonians

Like a mother feeding and looking after her own children, we felt so devoted and protective towards you, and had come to love you so much, that we were eager to hand over to you not only the Good News but our whole lives as well. Let me remind you, brothers, how hard we used to work, slaving night and day so as not to be a burden on any one of you while we were proclaiming God's Good News to you.

Another reason why we constantly thank God for you is that as soon as you heard the message that we brought you as God's message, you accepted it for what it really is, God's message and not some human thinking; and it is still a living power among you who believe it.

Alleluia, alleluia!

You have one Father, your Father in heaven; you have one teacher: the Lord Jesus Christ. Alleluia!

Gospel

Matthew 23:1 -12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

They do not practise what they preach.

Addressing the people and his disciples Jesus said, 'The scribes and the Pharisees occupy the chair of Moses. You must therefore do what they tell you and listen to what they say; but do not be guided by what they do: since they do not practise what they preach. They tie up heavy burdens and lay them on men's shoulders, but will they lift a finger to move them? Not they! Everything they do is done to attract attention, like wearing broader phylacteries and longer tassels, like wanting to take the place of honour at banquets and the front seats in the synagogues, being

greeted obsequiously in the market squares and having people call them Rabbi.

You, however, must not allow yourselves to be called Rabbi, since you have only one Master, and you are all brothers. You must call no one on earth your father, since you have only one Father, and he is in heaven. Nor must you allow yourselves to be called teachers, for you have only one Teacher, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Anyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and anyone who humbles himself will be exalted.'

REFLECTION by Fr Victor

Our gospel for this Sunday is about leaders. It is about what they say and what they do. It is about what sort of example they are for the people whom they are trying to lead and guide. At the time of Jesus, the religious leaders of the Jewish people were the Scribe and Pharisees. In front of the people gathered, Jesus makes a very public condemnation and criticism of these religious leaders. Jesus clearly says for everyone to hear: 'do not be guided by what they do, since they do not practice what they preach.' Strong words indeed. Jesus continues his criticism when he says that they always want to take the place of honour at meals and the best front seat in the synagogues.

What have these words of Jesus to do with us or say to us today? Jesus is warning us not to think of ourselves as being better than other people. We must be careful not to say one thing and then do the very opposite. We are not to speak and act in ways so that people will notice us and tell us how wonderful we are. The Pharisees knew the Law very well; what th lacked was mercy, compassion, and tenderness of heart. Their actions did not match their words. They expected others to follow the law and to be perfect, but they themselves were far from perfect.

God does not expect us to be perfect. However, we are asked to be genuine, honest, and authentic with ourselves, others, and God. When asked by the Pharisees what the greatest commandment was, Jesus replied, 'Love God with all your heart, soul and mind, and love your neighbour as yourself.' This is the heart of the Jewish Law, and it is at the heart of Jesus' message to us today.

We are called to follow Jesus who came to serve and not to be served. This is the example we are asked to follow and live by. This gospel calls us to ask ourselves whether we do and say things so that people will notice us. The warning and challenge that Jesus puts to Pharisees is the one that he puts to each of us today. As I strive to follow Jesus, can I also follow his example of what it means to lead? Can I serve others and not just expect to be served?

Holy Land/World Youth Day

Hearing the Gospel for years and then watching it come to life, was an unforgettable experience. We ventured across the same land our *Messiah* did 2000 years ago. Our young group was filled with curiosity and awe. Whether it was gazing upon the humble fields of Bethlehem, the celebration of the Eucharist in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee, or kneeling before the rock on which our Lord was crucified; within those moments, the peace of Heaven brushed the earth.

Personal encounters with God were not the only aspect of a pilgrimage, but also how we connected with other pilgrims walking alongside us. We learned patience with one another when exhaustion, frustration or dehydration crept up. We came to rejoice in each other's triumphs on our different spiritual journeys — sharing laughter, stories, and the odd bottle of wine.

World Youth Day in Lisbon was the culmination of a journey that we, as thirty pilgrims, shared together. We experienced the importance of a *small* community pursuing Christ, but in Portugal's capital we embraced a *universal* community of young 'Jesus-lovers': an estimated 1.5 million of us. Language barriers and cultural differences could not hinder the overflowing joy we shared with other Catholics as we sang, danced and worshipped together. Despite feeling physically exhausted by bus trips, flight transfers and passport panics, we had gained a new spiritual strength – a steroid-like grace from Our Lord which spiritually nourished our souls. I am hope that this will sustain us as we return to our own *worlds*.

I cannot express enough how grateful I am to all who made this magnificent journey possible: my diocese, parish and family for their generous sacrifices in giving me this oncein-a-life-time experience. **Ruby Brown**
