Entrance Antiphon

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11 A reading from the Acts of the **Apostles**

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it

happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading

Galatians 5:16-25

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since self-indulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When selfindulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, gross indecency and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling. jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and selfcontrol. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all selfindulgent passions and desire. Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

Fr. Victor's Reflection

This Sunday is Pentecost Sunday! We celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on the apostles gathered at the upper room in Jerusalem. This event marked the very beginning of the church. What is significant is how the first Pentecost experience brought together all peoples of the world thereby signifying the unifying work of the Holy Spirit through the church. According to the first reading, devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven assembled, and each one bewildered to hear the apostles speaking his own language. Unlike the tower of Babel when the world dispersed due to language barriers, the Pentecost experience assembled humanity without the barrier of language. The Holy Spirit speaks the language of love which is able to unite people.

The unifying work of the Holy Spirit is still alive in the church

today through this language of love. Through the sacraments, the church continues to reconcile the world. In the sacraments of baptism and penance, the Holy Spirit guides the church through the path of unity. At the table of the Eucharist, we gather as sons and daughters of God to share one cup and one bread. The sacramental language of the Eucharist is understood by all irrespective of geographical location.

Individually the Holy Spirit has its influence on us. The second reading enumerates the signs that accompany those under the influence of the Holy Spirit. The signs are the fruits of the Holy Spirit. They include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness, and self-control. These fruits unite the people of God and help to renew the face of the earth.

Expressions of Interest for 2024/2025 Christian Formation Course are now open.

Are you wanting to know more about Christianity and develop a deeper understanding of the Catholic Church? The Christian Formation Course (CFC) is a learning experience that allows participants to explore the foundational elements of the Catholic Faith Tradition. This one-year course introduces participants to scripture, theology, church history, sacramental life and liturgy.

- The Course runs across twelve (12) months and comprises eight (8) units.
- All who complete the Course are awarded a diocesan Certificate in Christian Formation

By engaging in the course, it is hoped participants will:

- become more confident in understanding the Catholic faith.
- grow in their capacity to reflect on their life's journey.
- realise that Christian faith is nurtured in community.
- be affirmed in their gifts for participating in the life of the faith community.
- grow in awareness of what it means to be a responsive member of the faith community.
