Entrance Antiphon

Acts of the Apostles 1:11 Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem. but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is,' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore

the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

Fr. Victor's Reflection

Dear Friends, we are coming closer to the end of Easter Season with the celebration of the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ. According to the first reading of this Sunday, Jesus took his apostles by surprise as he journeys with them to the mount of Olives and was taken up to heaven in their presence. After his resurrection, Jesus appeared to them in bodily form on many occasions. In all these appearances, Jesus explained to his disciples about the kingdom of God. Finally, before his ascension he instructed them to remain in Jerusalem until they receive the gift of the Holy Spirit or the baptism of the Holy Spirit.

At this time the disciples were still afraid of the Jews who were out to kill anyone associated with Jesus of Nazareth. Secondly, they were confused about the meaning of the Holy Spirit and how they would spread the Good News of the Kingdom of God as Jesus instructed them to go out and proclaim the good news to all nations. With these anxieties they waited in prayer at the upper room in the company of Our Blessed Lady.

As we celebrate this feast of ascension, we are like the disciples of Jesus. We have our fears, doubts, and anxieties. We have our personal reservations about the catholic faith, especially in this troubled world. There are some apparent inconsistencies that abound in our world e.g. Why bad things happen to good people. As we wait in prayer for the next nine days, till the Pentecost, let us bring all our worries, fears, and doubts before God. The baptism of the Holy Spirit will surely clear our doubts. We shall receive fresh understanding to face the reality of life. What is important is to take everything to the Lord in praver as we wait for the Holv Spirit.
