Fr. Victor's Reflection

The Season of Easter ended last Sunday when we celebrated the Feast of Pentecost. This Sunday, we celebrate the solemnity of the most Holy Trinity. We believe in the three persons of the Godhead - Father, Son, and Spirit. This celebration is about the person of God. It is the mystery of God in himself. God is one but three persons. All three act as one and equal in dignity. The Father created; the Son redeemed while the Spirit sanctified. In today's gospel, Matthew the evangelist reminded us that we were baptised into the life of the Trinity. Jesus commanded his apostles, 'Go, therefore, make disciples of all the nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit...' Through our baptism we were immersed into the love of the Trinity.

We should not be discouraged or confused as to how to pray to the

Trinity. Since they act as one though three, Jesus Christ the son is the revelation of God. As such, praying to Jesus is the same as praying to the Trinity. This is why Jesus said in today's gospel that all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to him. He is emphasising the unity of the blessed Trinity. There is no misunderstanding of the personality of God. The father sent the son into the world to redeem the world, the spirit proceeds from the father and the son in order to sanctify the world. The explanation of the persons of the Godhead does not remove the mystery, rather the mystery is continuously revealing itself each time we reflect on it.

The church invites us on this Sunday to reflect on this knowledge of God as three in one. Since we participate in the life of God through our baptism, we are called to live it out in our everyday life. We are called to imitate the unity of the Trinity. The imitation of the trinitarian love will help us overcome every form of indifference posing as obstacles to love in our lives.
