Second Reading

2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians *We believe, and therefore we speak.*

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – I believed, therefore I spoke - we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

That is why there is no weakening on our part, and instead, though this outer man of ours may be falling into decay, the inner man is renewed day by day. Yes, the troubles which are soon over, though they weigh little, train us for the carrying of a weight of eternal glory which is out of all proportion to them. And so we have no eyes for things that are visible, but only for things that are invisible; for visible things last only for a time, and the invisible things are eternal.

Mark 3:20-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

It is the end of Satan.

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saving. 'Beelzebul is in him,' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

Fr. Victor's Reflection

On the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time, the reality of blaming each other in times of crisis is brought before us in the readings. When there is a crisis, people do not really know how to go about it. Especially when the fundamental aspect of the society is threatened by the crisis. If the crisis threatens the unity of the society, then it opens up avenues for blame. Unfortunately, blaming does not solve any problem. Blaming reveals incompetence!

In the first reading, Adam and Eve have eaten of the forbidden fruit and the consequences are beginning to show their ugly faces. Not knowing what to do, they begin to blame one another. Adam in the heat of the tension referred to Eve as 'this woman.' The incompetence of Adam reveals itself in the blame. Of course it does not solve the problem, it shifts attention to another.

In the Gospel, the healing mission of Jesus Christ in casting out demons is challenged by the scribes who had come down from Jerusalem. They accused him of using the prince of demons in casting out demons. In his response, Jesus Christ made us understand the fact that: "If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either - it is the end of him."



Jesus Christ understands the inability of the Jewish religious leaders to deliver people from demonic attacks. He wants them to look up to him as the Son of God sent to deliver humanity. He will not respond to their blames with counter blames, rather he will go ahead to deliver the people tormented by demons.

We will be revealing our incompetence by blaming each other. Standing by each other in moments of crisis is the only solution. This is what Jesus Christ meant when he said that; '...if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. We need to be united in moments of crisis. Our unity will destroy any kind of external interference. <u>Stay Healthy, Stay Safe, Stay</u> Joyful and Stay Blessed!
