Fr. Victor's Reflection

The gospel on the 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year B, is a demonstration of Jesus' power over nature! Jesus calms the stormy sea as he sailed across with his apostles. The disciples woke Jesus with an accusation, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Like the apostles, we also wonder why God allows bad things to happen to God's people. It is somehow disturbing to see a good person suffer. We ask: God, do you not care?

Often this question is met without response from God. The reason is that in our desperation, we don't recognise the response of God in every situation or circumstance. God is not indifferent to our sufferings. His silence does not mean he is asleep. Rather his presence is enough courage for us. His presence is the blind spot that we don't recognise each time we face challenges. This is what we do not see in the sufferings of good people around us. The presence of Jesus in our lives is a firm foundation against any form of crisis. Our problems will not weigh us down because of the foundation is God's presence. His wisdom is there for us to discover a way out of the crisis. Our attitude to crisis will

change when we remember that we are founded in God's presence through our baptism.

Jesus was amazed at the lack of faith displayed by the apostles. They failed to see the blind spot that was his presence. He used this encounter to teach them that faith is anchored on God's inevitable presence. When we realise his presence, our perception changes. Mindful of his presence we realise. like St Paul in the second reading, not to judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. In the flesh we shield ourselves from the blind spot and focus on the crisis. In his presence we find the courage and wisdom to contain any kind of crisis.


