Fr Victor's Reflection

This Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world.

The first reading presents a vision of hope in the midst of tribulation. Daniel foretells the ultimate deliverance and resurrection, highlighting the rewards for those who are righteous. This vision assures us that, despite current hardships, ultimate victory of eternal glory awaits the righteous.

The Gospel of Mark presents the dramatic return of the Son of Man, accompanied by cosmic disturbances and the gathering of the elect from all corners of the earth. Jesus emphasises the certainty of these events, affirming that his words will never pass away, while also highlighting the unknown timing of these occurrences. This invites us to remain vigilant and be prepared, living in constant readiness for the fulfilment of God's promises and the ultimate establishment of his kingdom. It serves both as a warning and reassurance and also as a message of hope, urging steadfast faith and readiness for the end times.

Let us pray to the Lord, to help us to live in constant readiness, and be vigilant and faithful, as we anticipate the glorious return of the Son of man and to Strengthen our hearts with peace and fill us with hope as we await the fulfilment of God's kingdom.

Mercy Sisters Ecology Fellowship Program


