Fr Victor's Reflection

This Sunday is the solemnity of Christ the King and the last Sunday of the liturgical year B. The church calls us on this Sunday to reflect on the kingship of our saviour Jesus Christ. In the gospel this Sunday, Jesus reaffirms that he is a King. He answered the Roman Governor, Pontius Pilate; 'Mine is not a kingdom of this world; if my kingdom were of this world, my men would have fought to prevent my being surrendered to the Jews. But my kingdom is not of this kind.' Jesus stood his ground in affirming that his kingdom is of a different kind.

The kingdom of God is a kingdom of love, justice and peace. Jesus demonstrated this by his wilful self-sacrifice on the cross of calvary. It is a kingdom of peace hence there was no violence of revenge. It is a kingdom of love and peace because he forgave those who wrongfully accused him and forced Pilate to condemn him to death on the cross. This is the kingdom that we are born into through our baptism. Jesus bore witness to the truth and reality of this kingdom of God by his life and ministry. He reassures us that those on the side of truth will listen to his voice.

Pope Francis says, "The kingship of Jesus is completely different than that of the world: He did not come to dominate but to serve. He did not come amid signs of power, but with the power of signs. He is not like other kings, but he is King for the others".

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the king, let us truly accept that Christ is our King and follow his Values so that we will be able to bring difference in the world.
