Fourth Candle

Our Advent journey is almost complete, and the Christ child will soon be here.

As we light the fourth candle, we are reminded of the peace that only Christ can give.

All: But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to rule in Israel, whose origin is from of old, from ancient days. Therefore, he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labour has brought forth; then the rest of his

kindred shall return to the people of Israel. And he shall stand and feed his flock in the strength of the Lord, in the majesty of the name of the Lord his God. And they shall live secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth; and he shall be the one of peace. (Micah 5:2-5a) *God's peace is meant for the whole of creation; together, we anticipate the day of his coming.*



All: God our Saviour, you alone are the Prince of Peace who shall rule with justice and love. As we seek to be bearers of your peace in the world, may we find our security in your grace – and may we be sources of peace and safety to others. **Amen.**

A reading from the prophet Micah

Out of you will be born the one who is to rule over Israel.

You, Bethlehem Ephrathah, the least of the clans of Judah, out of you will be born for me the one who is to rule over Israel; his origin goes back to the distant past, to the days of old. The Lord is therefore going to abandon them till the time when she who is to give birth gives birth. Then the remnant of his brothers will come back

to the sons of Israel. He will stand and feed his flock with the power of the Lord, with the majesty of the name of his God. They will live secure, for from then on he will extend his power to the ends of the land. He himself will be peace.

Hebrews 10:5-10

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

I am coming to do your will.

This is what Christ said, on coming into the world:

You who wanted no sacrifice or oblation, prepared a body for me.

You took no pleasure in holocausts or sacrifices for sin;

then I said,

- just as I was commanded in the scroll of the book,
- 'God, here I am! I am coming to obey your will.'

Notice that he says first: You did not want what the Law lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the oblations, the holocausts and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them; and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to obey your will. He is abolishing the first sort to replace it with the second. And this will was for us to be made holy by the offering of his body made once and for all by Jesus Christ.

For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

Fr Victor's Reflection

We remember the time and date of the birth of our family members. We look back and remember the day they came into our family. We might look at photographs of them when they were younger. We might remember their first steps and their first day at school. Then we celebrate with them. We give thanks for and celebrate the difference they have made and still make in our families.

This is exactly what we do at Christmas; we remember, and we celebrate. We recall and tell that story of how, where and when Jesus was born. We tell the story of Mary and Joseph going back to Bethlehem. We recall that they were turned away because there was no space for them. We remember that the shepherds and the kings came when Jesus was born. Then we joyfully celebrate the difference and impact that Jesus has made and is making to our world and to each of us personally.

We are asked to remember that Christmas is not something that happened in the past. The birth of Jesus echoes and ripples through the century's right down to us today. Through the birth of Jesus God enters our world, our time and our lives. Jesus is Emmanuel, God-is-with us. In and through the person of Jesus, God reaches out to embrace each of us. Through the birth of Jesus God comes to live amongst us and deeply within us. Christmas is not just about remembering the birth of Jesus; it is about celebrating the presence of Jesus in our hearts and in our lives today.

When he was Pope, John Paul II, wrote that the mystery of Jesus that took place over 2000 years ago must be lived today and every day. The word of God who found a dwelling place in and through Mary comes to knock on our hearts this Christmas and every Christmas, this day and every day.

May Christ the light and the light of Christ fill all our homes, hearts, families and the whole world this Christmas and always.
