

Fr Victor's Reflection

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature, co-equal and co-eternal. Our mind cannot grasp this doctrine which teaches that 1+1+1 = 1 and not 3. But we believe in this Mystery because Jesus, who is God, taught it clearly, the Evangelists recorded it, the Fathers of the Church tried to explain it, and the Councils of Nicaea and Constantinople defined it as a dogma of Christian Faith

The Holy Trinity plays an important role in our Christian life. All prayers in the Church begin in the Name of the Holy Trinity and end glorifying the Trinity. All the Sacraments are administered (we are baptized, confirmed, anointed, our sins are forgiven, our marriages are blessed, and our

Bishops, priests and deacons are ordained) in the name of the Holy Trinity. And we bless ourselves, and the priest blesses us, in the Name of the Holy Trinity.

There is a perfect love and harmony in the Holy Trinity. The love shared by the three persons of the Holy Trinity radiates the love of God in the life of the church. The Father created, the Son redeemed, and the Spirit sanctifies. One God in three persons. From the first reading we learn that the persons of the Trinity are always united at each moment in human salvation history. They were together during the creation of the world; during the salvific ministry of Jesus Christ and now that we live under the advocacy of the Holy Spirit.

The future of the church lies in the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The unity of the Trinity will continue to manifest in the church. The works of creation and salvation of humanity will be preserved by the sanctification of the Holy Spirit. Alleluia! Stay Healthy, Stay Safe and Stay Blessed!
