The Lord disciplines those he loves.

Have you forgotten that encouraging text in which you are addressed as sons? My son, when the Lord corrects you, do not treat it lightly; but do not get discouraged when he reprimands you. For the Lord trains the ones that he loves and he punishes all those that he acknowledges as his sons. Suffering is part of your training; God is treating you as his sons. Has there ever been any son whose father did not train him? Of course, any punishment is most painful at the time, and far from pleasant; but later, in those on whom it has been used, it bears fruit in peace and goodness. So, hold up your limp arms and steady your trembling knees and smooth out the path you tread; then the injured limb will not be wrenched, it will grow strong again.

enter by the narrow door, because I tell you, many will try to enter and will not succeed.

'Once the master of the house has got up and locked the door, you may find yourself knocking on the door, saying, "Lord, open to us" but he will answer, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will find yourself saying, "We once ate and drank in your company; you taught in our streets" but he will reply, "I do not know where you come from. Away from me, all you wicked men!"

'Then there will be weeping and grinding of teeth, when you

see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God, and yourselves turned outside. And men from east and west, from north and south, will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

'Yes, there are those now last who will be first, and those now first who will be last.'

Fr Victor's Reflection


In the gospel on 21st Sunday in ordinary time, Jesus was asked a question about salvation while on his way to Jerusalem. He answered by urging us to strive to enter by the narrow door, because many will try to enter and will not succeed. The image of the narrow door is used by Jesus to tell us that conditions apply with regards to entrance into the kingdom of heaven. It is a way of telling us that there are virtues necessary for the kingdom of heaven. It is a narrow door because not everything can pass through it. Christian virtues make us light and fit to pass through the narrow door.

A mixture of virtue and vice will not pass through it. We are products of our culture and environment. It is possible that we may have inherited prejudices, dispositions and ideologies contrary to the principles of the kingdom of heaven. Some of us have some reservations about the church's doctrines based on life experience. A mixture of all these will block our way and sometimes make it difficult to enter through the narrow door.

To rid ourselves of these prejudices, dispositions and ideologies will require the kind of discipline mentioned in the second reading according to the letter to the Hebrews. It used the image of a

father using love to discipline and train the child. Striving to enter the narrow door is God's loving way of training us to be fit for the kingdom of heaven. It is out of love that he warns us to strive. It is not enough to bear the name Christian; it must reflect in our lives. There is a need for a continuous reassessment of our lives. Only the virtuous can pass through the narrow door with ease.
