First Reading

Hab 1:2-3; 2:2-4

A reading from the prophet Habakkuk

The just will live by faithfulness.

How long, Lord, am I to cry for help while you will not listen; to cry 'Oppression!' in your ear and you will not save? Why do you set injustice before me, why do you look on where there is tyranny? Outrage and violence, this is all I see, all is contention, and discord flourishes.

Then the Lord answered and said,

'Write the vision down, inscribe it on tablets to be easily read, since this vision is for its own time only: eager for its own fulfilment, it does not deceive; if it comes slowly, wait, for come it will, without fail. See how he flags, he whose soul is not at rights, but the upright man will live by his faithfulness.'

(R.) If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

- 1. Come, ring out our joy to the Lord; hail the rock who saves us. Let us come before him, giving thanks, with songs let us hail the Lord. (R.)
- 2. Come in; let us bow and bend low; let us kneel before the God who made us for he is our God and we the people who belong to his pasture, the flock that is led by his hand. (R.)

Second Reading

2 Tm 1:6-8, 13-14

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy Never be ashamed of witnessing the Lord.

I am reminding you to fan into a flame the gift that God gave you when I laid my hands on you. God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control. So you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God.

Keep as your pattern the sound teaching you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. You have been trusted to look after something precious; guard it with the help of the Holy Spirit who lives in us.

Gospel Lk 17:5-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke If you had faith!

The apostles said to the Lord, 'Increase our faith.' The Lord replied, 'Were your faith the size of a mustard seed you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.

'Which of you, with a servant ploughing or minding sheep, would say to him when he returned from the fields, "Come and have your meal immediately"? Would he not be more likely to say, "Get my supper laid; make yourself tidy and wait on me while I eat and drink. You can eat and

drink yourself afterwards"? Must he be grateful to the servant for doing what he was told? So with you: when you have done all you have been told to do, say, "We are merely servants: we have done no more than our duty."'



The Gospel of the Lord

REFLECTION by Fr Victor

On 27th Sunday of ordinary time, the Church invites us to reflect on one of the most important Christian and theological virtues – Faith. It is the foundation of our Christian life. Faith gives us a new vision and version of life. The Church defined Christian faith as the supernatural gift of God that enables us to believe without doubting whatever God reveals. In the gospel on 27th Sunday, the apostles jointly requested Jesus to increase their faith. This request was for them to be strong in the face of hardship. But Jesus reminded them that faith as little as a mustard seed is enough. Jesus wants them to understand that faith is not an abstract, it is a practical reality. The practicality of Christian faith is that truth must triumph over falsehood. Faith enables us to stand by the truth of God's revelation against all odds. This explains why the first reading ended with the sentence; the upright man will live by his faithfulness. In moments of hardship, the natural tendency in us is to do away with morality. We are quick to resort to unethical alternative means when the hardship we face appears overwhelming. In my opinion, the current rise in energy bills and prices of food is a test of faith. The choice before us is either to face it as true Christians or non-Christians.

If our resolution is to face the current crisis as faithful Christian's, the second reading is very reassuring. St Paul while advising Timothy reminds us of the nature of the gift we received from God. According to him, 'God's gift was not a spirit of timidity, but the Spirit of power, and love, and self-control. So, you are never to be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord, or ashamed of me for being his prisoner; but with me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God'. Faith is enough for us to live through hardships. Faith keeps our minds focused on the truth of God's revelation in the face of any form of hardship. Christian fidelity is tested and proven in hardship.

Volunteers are also needed to move items from the Church to the Convent on Friday 10 October at 10am. Thank you for your assistance.










