### 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time - YEAR C

First Reading Ex 17:8-13

A reading from the book of Exodus

As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage.

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

### **Second Reading**

2 Tm 3:14 - 4:2

19 October

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy This is how the people of God become equipped and ready for every good work.

You must keep to what you have been taught and know to be true; remember who your teachers were, and how, ever since you were a child, you have known the holy scriptures – from these you can learn the wisdom that leads to salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who is to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom: proclaim the message and, welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. Refute falsehood, correct error, call to obedience – but do all with patience and with the intention of teaching.

Alleluia!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *God will see those who cry to him vindicated.* 

Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart. 'There was a judge in a certain town' he said 'who had neither fear of God nor respect for man. In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, "I want justice from you against my enemy!" For a long time he refused, but at

last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death.""

And the Lord said, 'You notice what the unjust judge has to say? Now will not God see justice done to his chosen who cry to him day and night even when he delays to help them? I promise you, he will see justice done to them, and done speedily. But when the Son of Man

comes, will he find any faith on earth?'

### REFLECTION by Fr Victor

This Sunday is Mission Sunday. Let us pray for all the missionaries all over the world, who face lots of struggles and persecutions. Let us also support them generously through our material resources.

The readings on 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Year C, centre on the power of persistent prayer and the faith that endures even when answers seem delayed. Jesus tells the parable of the persistent widow, a woman who refuses to give up until she receives justice from an unjust judge. Her perseverance becomes a model for discipleship — a reminder that faith is not a one-time act, but a lifelong journey of trust and perseverance.

In the first reading (Exodus 17:8–13), we find Moses standing on the hilltop, his hands raised in prayer while Israel battles the Amalekites. As long as his arms are lifted, the Israelites prevail; when he grows weary and lowers them, the enemy gains ground. So, Aaron and Hur come to his side, supporting his arms until victory is won. This powerful image teaches us that prayer often requires persistence and community. When our faith falters, we lean on others; when others weaken, we lift them up.

The Gospel (Luke 18:1–8) echoes this same lesson - God is not indifferent like the unjust judge. If even a corrupt official can be moved by persistence, how much more will our compassionate Father respond to the cries of His children? Yet Jesus ends with a probing question: "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on earth?" This question invites us to reflect on our own prayer life. Do we continue to pray when answers don't come? Do we trust God's timing even when we don't see results?

Persistent prayer is not about wearing God down; it is about wearing down our own resistance to His will. Through prayer, our hearts are transformed, our faith is strengthened, and our hope renewed. Like the widow, we are called to "pray always and never lose" heart."

Let us, then, be steadfast in prayer — for our families, our community, our Church, and our world. And when our arms grow weary, may we find strength in one another, just as Moses did.

May the Lord grant us faith that endures, hope that perseveres, and love that never gives up.


