The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica - YEAR C

First Reading

Ezekiel 47:1-2. 8-9. 12

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I see water flowing from the temple and all who were touched by it were saved.

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. The man went to the east holding his measuring line and measured off a thousand cubits; he then made me wade across the stream; the water reached my ankles. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across the stream again; the water reached my knees. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; the water reached my waist. He measured off another thousand; it was now a river which I could not cross; the stream had swollen and was now deep water, a river impossible to cross. He then said, 'Do you see, son of man?' He took me further, then brought me back to the bank of the river. When I got back, there were many trees on each bank of the river. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the

Gospel John 2:13-22

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

He spoke about the temple of his own body.

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market'. Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up'. The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.

Reflection by Fr Graham

Homilette Jn 2 13 22 Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

It must seem commemorating the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica, a building in Rome atop the Caelian Hill, one of the seven hills of Rome. Seven hilltop villages accreted and merged to be "Rome". The land on which the Papal Archbasilica of Christ the Saviour and Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist is situated was originally owned by the Lateran (It.: Laterano) family/clan. It was acquired by the Roman emperors. With the conversion to Christianity of the Emperor Constantine and the cessation of the murdering of Christians, it was subsequently given to the Pope in AD324 and became his Cathedral (seat church) as Bishop of Rome. St. John Lateran's official title includes "Mother and Head of All churches in Rome and in the World". This is part of the reason for this feast in all our Catholic churches. It is the only arch major papal basilica. It is one of the four major papal basilicas illustrated on a papal blessing certificate (bottom left). In Sydney we have St. Mary's minor papal basilica where our

Metropolitan Archbishop Fisher is seated. Notice also that today's Gospel comes from St. John. (Jn 2: 13-22)

"Catholic" is one of the four *marks* of the Church founded by God Himself and expressed in the Nicene Creed by us universally as His Christian Church since AD325. "The Church is catholic or universal both because she possesses the fullness of Christ's presence and the means of salvation, and because she has been sent out by Christ on a mission to the whole of the human race." (CCC 750, 830) The Church is people, not steeple. We are to be living stones. As members of that Church (capital "C") of people baptised into the Life of Christ, we come in to a church building (small "c").

Christ Himself is the Head of the Church and we are His Body. We are so far from the perfection of His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Most Blessed Sacrament, yet this is the final sacrament of our initiation into His body on earth, the Church. We are given to eat in this journeying, pilgrim Church in Mass His living Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Most Blessed Sacrament, so that we may have Eternal Food for the journey of faith, His Real Presence in the Host, changed from bread and wine into the Living Godhead to give the foretaste and sanctification of the Life of Heaven, the Eternal Jerusalem, the New Garden of Eden: The Wedding Feast of the Lamb of God Who feeds us to take away our sins. This is our true freedom as sons and daughters of the Son of Man and Son of God. Where the crucified and resurrected Head, Jesus has gone, we His body hope and pray, by the supernatural way of the Sacraments, most particularly the Blessed Sacrament from which all other sacraments have their power of Grace, to follow. Christ is the Keystone. He wants us as living stones in the Rock of His Church, founded on Simon-Peter. We as Church go to Mass. We do not go to church. We are Church. We go to be fed and nurtured by the Living God. We are to go out as living temples of the Holy Spirit, leaven for the world.
