Take yourselves, brothers, at the time when you were
called: how many of you were wise in the ordinary
sense of the word, how many were influential people,
or came from noble families? No, it was to shame the
wise that God chose what is foolish by human
reckoning, and to shame what is strong that he chose
what is weak by human reckoning; those whom the
world thinks common and contemptible are the ones
that God has chosen – those who are nothing at all to
show up those who are everything. The human race
has nothing to boast about to God, but you, God has
made members of Christ Jesus and by God's doing
he has become our wisdom, and our virtue, and our
holiness, and our freedom. As scripture says: if
anyone wants to boast, let him boast about the Lord.

The Gospel of the Lord

Reflection by Fr Victor

The Gospel on 4th Sunday in Ordinary time, places us on the hillside with Jesus as He proclaims the Beatitudes. These are not rules for the strong and successful, but promises for the humble, the gentle, the merciful, and those who trust in God. Jesus calls blessed those the world often overlooks. In God's kingdom, greatness is measured not by power or status, but by love, faith, and a heart open to Him.

The first reading invites us to seek the Lord in humility, while St Paul reminds us that God chooses what is simple and weak to reveal His strength. This is good news for every family, every child, every parish community: holiness is possible for all, right where we are.

As I write this final bulletin message for you, I do so with deep gratitude. It has been a blessing to walk with you, to pray with you, and to witness your faith lived out in ordinary and beautiful ways. Like the Beatitudes, parish life is built not on perfection, but on shared faith, patience, kindness, and trust in God.

Thank you for your love, your prayers, and your support. Please remember me in your prayers, as you will remain in mine. May the Lord bless you and keep you always.

As I take leave of this parish community, I do so with a grateful heart. Thank you for welcoming me into your lives, your homes, and your celebrations of faith. I have been enriched by your kindness, your patience, and your quiet witness to the Gospel. Though I take up a new position as a Spiritual Director at the Seminary in Wagga Wagga, I carry you with me in prayer and thanksgiving. May God continue the good work He has begun among you.

May the Lord bless this parish with hearts that are poor in spirit, gentle in love, and rich in mercy. May your families be strengthened in faith, your children grow in wisdom and grace, and may this community always reflect the Beatitudes in daily life.

May Almighty God bless you, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.
