The Epiphany of the Lord – YEAR A

First Reading

Isaiah 60:1-6

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The glory of the Lord shines upon you.

Arise, shine out, Jerusalem, for your light has come, the glory of the Lord is rising on you, though night still covers the earth and darkness the peoples.

Above you the Lord now rises and above you his glory appears. The nations come to your light and kings to your dawning brightness.

Lift up your eyes and look round: all are assembling and coming towards you, your sons from far away and your daughters being tenderly carried.

At this sight you will grow radiant, your heart throbbing and full; since the riches of the sea will flow to you; the wealth of the nations come to you;

camels in throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense and singing the praise of the Lord.

Ephesians 3:2-3. 5-6

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

The revelation means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body.

You have probably heard how I have been entrusted by God with the grace he meant for you, and that it was by a revelation that I was given the knowledge of the mystery. This mystery that has now been revealed through the Spirit to his holy apostles and prophets was unknown to any men in past generations; it means that pagans now share the same inheritance, that they are parts of the same body, and that the same promise has been made to them, in Christ Jesus, through the gospel.

Gospel Matthew 2:1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew We have come from the East to worship the king.

After Jesus had been born at Bethlehem in Judaea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the east. 'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him, 'for this is what the prophet wrote:

And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, you are by no means least among the leaders of Judah,

for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel.'

Then Herod summoned the wise men to see him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight, and going into the house they saw the child with his mother Mary, and falling to their knees they did him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, and returned to their own country by a different way.

Reflection by Fr Victor

The Solemnity of the Epiphany celebrates the beautiful and hope-filled truth that **Jesus Christ is revealed to all nations**. The visit of the Magi shows us that God's saving love knows no boundaries. Guided by a star, these seekers from distant lands set out on a journey of faith, trusting that God would lead them—and they are not disappointed.

The Gospel reminds us that the Magi find the newborn King not in a place of power or comfort, but in simplicity and humility. Their journey teaches us that God often reveals Himself in unexpected ways and ordinary places. What matters most is a heart that is open, searching, and willing to be led.

The gifts they offer—gold, frankincense, and myrrh—are rich in meaning. Gold honours Christ as King, frankincense acknowledges His divinity, and myrrh points to His humanity and future suffering. These gifts also invite us to reflect on what we bring to the Lord today: our faith, our time, our struggles, our hopes, and our willingness to serve.

After encountering Jesus, the Magi "returned by another way." This small detail carries a powerful message. A true encounter with Christ always

changes us. Epiphany challenges us not only to seek Christ, but also to allow His presence to transform the way we live—how we treat others, how we make decisions, and how we witness to our faith.

As we celebrate this feast, may we be attentive to the "stars" God places in our lives—Scripture, prayer, the sacraments, and the needs of those around us. May we follow Christ faithfully and become **reflections of His light**, so that our parish and our world may be filled with hope, peace, and joy.

It will be sad to see you go Fr Victor, but we wish you well on the next step in your journey.


Fr Sabu Pulimalayil will take up as an Administrator of the Parish.
