First Reading

Isaiah 58:7-10

His head will be raised in glory. **(R.)**

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Your light will shine like the dawn.

Thus says the Lord:

Share your bread with the hungry,
and shelter the homeless poor,
clothe the man you see to be naked
and turn not from your own kin.
Then will your light shine like the dawn
and your wound be quickly healed over.

Your integrity will go before you
and the glory of the Lord behind you.
Cry, and the Lord will answer;
call, and he will say, 'I am here.'

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

I came to you to proclaim Christ crucified.

When I came to you, brothers, it was not with any show of oratory or philosophy, but simply to tell you what God had guaranteed. During my stay with you, the only knowledge I claimed to have was about Jesus, and only about him as the crucified Christ. Far from relying on any power of my own, I came among you in great 'fear and trembling' and in my speeches and the sermons that I gave, there were none of the arguments that belong to philosophy; only a demonstration of the power of the Spirit. And I did this so that your faith should not depend on human philosophy but on the power of God.

'You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill-top cannot be hidden. No one lights a lamp to put it under

a tub; they put it on the lamp-stand where it shines for everyone in the house. In the same way your light must shine in the sight of men, so that, seeing your good works, they may give the praise to your Father in heaven.'

Reflection by Fr Sabu

Dearests,

On this fifth Sunday in ordinary time we are called to reflect the impact and influence that we believers are called to have on the world as the 'salt of the earth' and the 'light of the world'. Just as the salt, even in small amounts, influences the taste of the food, we are to have positive and noticeable influence on the world. This requires maintaining integrity and living out our faith authentically and consistently. If salt loses its saltiness, it becomes useless; similarly, if we lose our distinctiveness by compromising our values, we fail our mission. Just as light provides visibility and guidance, we have the responsibility to illuminate the truth and guide others towards God. When we truly fulfill our role as salt and light, the beneficiaries of our words and actions will be led to praise and glorify God.

As we said farewell to Father Victor, who has been a light and salt for our parish community, we continue accompany him with our prayer support so that he could be a real guiding light for the future priests of the Diocese of Wagga Wagga. I hope all goes well in Wagga and he will be appreciated for the quality man and priest that he is. St. John Chrysostom once said that 'Synod is the name of the Church' - a journey we make together. The church must therefore be like a choir, in which the members relate to each other in harmony and order, and are united by love that transcends differences. Thanks for the kind welcome you have given me, and I look forward to be part of this parish community sharing the light and saltiness.
