A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the  
Corinthians

*God in his wisdom predestined our glory before the ages  
began.*

We have a wisdom to offer those who have reached  
maturity: not a philosophy of our age, it is true, still  
less of the masters of our age, which are coming to  
their end. The hidden wisdom of God which we teach  
in our mysteries is the wisdom that God predestined  
to be for our glory before the ages began. It is a  
wisdom that none of the masters of this age have  
ever known, or they would not have crucified the Lord  
of Glory; we teach what scripture calls: the things that  
no eye has seen and no ear has heard, things  
beyond the mind of man, all that God has prepared  
for those who love him.

These are the very things that God has revealed to us  
through the Spirit, for the Spirit reaches the depths of  
everything, even the depths of God.

## **Gospel**     **Matthew 5:17-37**

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

*Such was said to your ancestors; but I am speaking to you.*

Jesus said to his disciples: 'Do not imagine that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets. I have come not to abolish them but to complete them. I tell you solemnly, till heaven and earth disappear, not one dot, one little stroke, shall disappear from the Law until its purpose is achieved. Therefore, the man who infringes even one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be considered the least in the kingdom of heaven; but the man who keeps them and teaches them will be considered great in the kingdom of heaven.

'For I tell you, if your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven.

'You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not kill; and if anyone does kill he must answer for it before the court. But I say this to you: anyone who is angry with his brother will answer for it before the court; if a man calls his brother "Fool" he will answer for it before the Sanhedrin; and if a man calls him "Renegade" he will answer for it in hell fire. So then, if you are bringing your offering to the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar, go and be reconciled with your brother first, and then come back and present your offering. Come to terms with your opponent in good time while you are still on the way to the court with him, or he may hand you over to the judge and the judge to the officer, and you will be thrown into prison. I tell you solemnly, you will not get out till you have paid the last penny.

'You have learnt how it was said: You must not commit adultery. But I say this to you: if a man looks at a woman lustfully, he has already committed adultery with her in his heart. If your right eye should cause you to sin, tear it out and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body thrown into hell. And if your right hand should cause you to sin, cut it off and throw it away; for it will do you less harm to lose one part of you than to have your whole body go to hell.

'It has also been said: Anyone who divorces his wife must give her a writ of dismissal. But I say this to you: everyone who divorces his wife, except for the case of fornication, makes her an adulteress; and anyone who marries a divorced woman commits adultery.

'Again, you have learnt how it was said to our ancestors: You must not break your oath, but must fulfil your oaths to the Lord. But I say this to you: do not swear at all, either by heaven, since that is God's throne; or by the earth, since that is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, since that is the city of the great king. Do not swear by your own head either, since you cannot turn a single hair white or black. All you need say is "Yes" if you mean yes, "No" if you mean no; anything more than this comes from the evil one.'

## **Reflection by Fr Sabu**

Dearests,

On this sixth Sunday of Ordinary time is the last Sunday before the season of Lent. We begin lent with Ash Wednesday. Lent is a special season in the Church lasting about 40days, to help us to prepare for Easter. It is a time of reflection, repentance and renewal, leading up to the celebration of Jesus' Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

In the Gospel today, Jesus underscores that He came to fulfill the Law. Unlike the Pharisees, often focused on external observances and ritual purity, Jesus calls for a deeper, heart-centred righteousness that goes beyond mere legalistic observances.

Lent is marked by three key practices: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These practices are rooted in love, mercy and justice. During the season of Lent, we are to take radical measures to avoid sin, maintain inner purity, and guard our thoughts and desires when it comes to interacting with others. Lent invites us to grow closer to God and prepare our hearts for the Easter joy. I pray and wish you all a Grace filled Lent and Happy Sunday!
